Summer flew by so quickly, I can hardly believe it's already September! The temperature is dropping and Fall will be officially here soon.

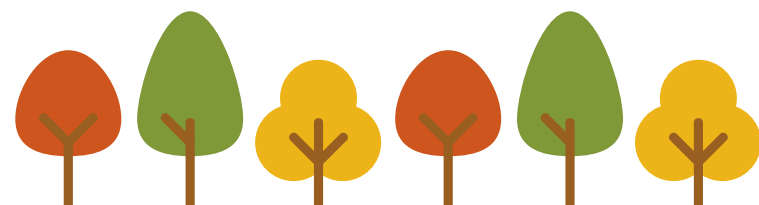

Community Service

REPORT BY ELLIE SYME QUAYLE

Street Cleaning is scheduled for Saturday, October 10th, at 8:30 a.m. Bring your racks, grabbers, and gloves and let's make Park Boulevard beautiful.

Catholic Community Services is in need of help to pack what they call "Pantry Packs". This program replaces "Bridging the Gap" which we have been involved in the past. Bridging the Gap Truck can no longer deliver supplies on the school grounds, which eliminates the need for our help with that program. CCS will contact us when they have the supplies to pack the Pantry Packs and we will get in touch with the members to see what type of help we can be. Several members have expressed a desire to participate with hands-on service and this may be an excellent opportunity for us to get more involved.

YCC Footsteps to Light will not be held in the previous format they have done in years past. This year they are getting Purple Flags to be displayed on the YCC Grounds and around the building instead of tying the purple ribbons we have done before. They will ask us to help with that as soon as they know when that will be. In addition, they will be having the event on October 17, at 7:00 p.m. It will be a "live streamed event" for recognition of individuals and Companies who have contributed, and recognizing those individuals who have experienced domestic violence this past year. More information will be available soon. We will still make our \$500 donation to the event which may be used to help purchase the purple flags and to help pay for Bill Board postings, and poster boards.

RMR District Meeting Hands-On Project: The Ogden Club District Meeting Committee has proposed that our Hands-On Event during the District Meeting be to collect Durable Backpacks and school supplies for the Clermont Care Center Orphanage in Haiti. Many of you know that our own member, Carmel Clermont, started and supports an orphanage in Haiti which she mostly supports on her own and we are asking the attendees to the RMR District Meeting to support this project by bringing items to the District Meeting. The list includes Durable Backpacks, Composition Notebooks, Pencils & Erasers, Pencil Sharpeners, Crayons, Face Masks (Reusable/Washable), coloring books with ABC's and 1,2,3's, and Geometry Kits (compass, Protractor, Ruler). The packets will be assembled at the meeting on Saturday afternoon September 26.
